The D. viewed the Enemys Camp at Chivres which most people thought very Strong and that it would have been impossible to have attacked them there unless we could have got on upon one of their Wings, We received here advise of the Duke of Savoys having left Toulon on the 22^o Ultimo

The Enemy continuing in their Camp at Antoigne waiting our Motion to pass the Scheld it was thought not adviseable to pass the Scheld at Helchin where we passed last Year so the Army took their March passing a little below Ath & encamped the right at Bassebracle, and the left at Lessines where the Artillery and Baggage joined us
