The Grenadiers to be put in three Divisions and lodged at the
Barriers where they are to keep an Officer and twenty five Men
constantly upon Guard the Pickets of each Regiment to lie every
night on their Arms at the head of their Regiments, no Officer to
be in Quarters except, the Generals and Commanders of Regiments.
The Officer of the Grand Guard to observe the General Officers Orders
and send Patrouilles accordingly, each Regiment to keep Guard
in Front or Rear as they think most proper to hinder their Men from
going out, no body to Forrage till they have orders, no Merodino
pain of severe punishment as the Commander shall answer, the
Lieut: Colonel to go the Round and to make a report at eight in the
morning

M. 13 This day we had Accounts that about 9 last night when the
Enemy saw we had withdrawn from before Lens they abandoned
the place, and that there had only been a few Squadrons from the
Duke of Berwick's near that place to favour their Retreat so that
every body believed had we but gone on to it with the Foot & Cannon
we should have taken them prisoners, This Night Preston's Regt
and a Detachment of Horse was sent to Lens and upon the Acc^t
of the Detachments sent from Mde Vendoures My Lord Duke
Detached 15 Battalions and 20 Squadrons with L. Genl Reid
& Officers to join us
