 Army to convey the Great Cannon & Ammunition from Bruxelles to
 the Army. We reckon'd Prince Eugene with this Detachm. near 50000.
 strong and in case the Enemy had made any Motion towards him the
 whole Army was in readiness to march to him. Next morning Prince
 Eugene with Lieut. Gen. Doph followed this Detachment to take care
 of the Cannon & watch the motions of the Duke of Burgundy's Army
 who had made sev. Detachments towards the Pais d'Alost. This
 Evening upon Advice that he had detached a great Body Monsieur de
 la Lick was sent with 12 Squadrons to reinforce our former Detachm.
