at the same time 2 Subaltorns with 80 Men to be at Waructon, all these Detachm^{ts}
to be as light as possible for marching Tomorrow at 8 in the Morning at
Ropes Regiment, 2 Brigad^{rs} Pimicos & Sabino with 4 Col: 4 Lieut: Col: 4
Major & 2600 to cover the foragers of the right Wing, the foragers to
be at the Head of their Regiments at 6 in the Morning & to march by the
right, a Capt of a Brigade and a Subaltorn of the Regiment to conduct
them and to be answerable for all Disorders, at the firing of 5 Cannon
all the Heavy Baggage to be sent into the Entrenchments at Monin
and the Baggage tolerable with the Army to be sent to the Artillery, the
Foragers to return when they hear these Guns fired, all those who have
poor Horses to return them.

14th: The 500 Men marched in the Night by a spare directions and cut down
all the sluices on the Duille about Wambreehis and other places near
Lido which made the Enemy believe we did not intend to besiege that
place, and they cut down the sluices on the Marsh this Detachment took
60 Prisoners.

This gave an Alarm in Lido. believing they were going to be invested
and Mon^r Trouflers came without the Gates with some Squadrons.

The Right Wing of the Army foraged between Menin & Roselaar,
We expected now every day Accounts of some Movements from the Enemy
and in fact they sh^d. endeavour to attack our Cannon, the Army was ordered
at the firing of 5 Guns to send away all their heavy Baggage that we
might march with Expedition to meet Prince Eugene
