21<sup>B</sup> We had repeated Orders every minute to be in a readiness to March, we received Accounts that the Duke of Berwick had passed in the Neighbourhood of Mons, with his Army. We had a convoy of Bread sent to Ath where we had likewise good stores of Ammunition which was Ordered to be got ready in case the Enemy should go towards their own Country that we might bring it off with us for the Service of the Siege.

To be in a readiness still to March at the 3 Guns, The General to beat and the Baggage to be sent to the Artillery no body to stir out of Camp on pain of Death if we dont March, The post at Henay to be relieved at Night. Ordered at Night. No body to be out of the Way when the 3 Cannon fire the General is to beat and immediately the Assembly and March, Three Battalions beside the 2 Camps at Orvir to march with the Artillery, The 2<sup>nd</sup> Regts to be at break of day at Rantrauw's Regiment of Horse and a Lieut. Col. with them. The Generals of the day in case we dont March to be at nine in the Morning at my Lord Duke's.

21<sup>B</sup>. This Night we received Advices that the Enemy were in movement and come with their whole Army thro Ghent to Melle upon which it was Ordered to send the 2<sup>nd</sup> Regts to mark the Camp between Anchin and Moutiers to be nearer the Enemy at their junction in case they should attempt any thing on Bruelles
