11th 11th Our Entrenchments were finished and Cannon playd upon them This day when my Lord Duke was at dinner, divers Accounts were brought to him that the Enemy were Foraging just by his L^{ty} he gave orders to Major Gen Webb to take the next two Battalions at hand and chase them away the Battalions were Hous & Temples who march with Mr Webb the Duke of Argyll and several others Volunteers, we found the Enemy very well posted in the Hedges at the Chateau of Coeline where we attacked them and beat them into the
