At the firing of 3 Guns the foot to take Arms and the horse to saddle otherwise to take no Alarm the Lieut: General of the day to see the Ground marked in the Entrenchments for each Regiment a Serjeant with 12 Men to be left on each Regiments Ground. The Drums with the Camp Colours to be at 3 this Afternoon at the head of their Reg^{ts}.

13. We had some Rumours that the Enemy designed a movement nearer us and it was Reported they designed to attack us having waited hitherto for Orders from Court which Mons: Chamillard had now brought them. Our Army was ordered to be in a readines and each Regiments ground to be marked on the Entrenchment
