MB. Between ten and eleven in the Morning the Enemy made a movement nearer us with their whole Army in order of Battle as if they designed to attack us, upon which the Army took arms and every body went to their Posts. The Enemy advanced a considerable body of Dragoons and all their picquets and in the Afternoon made some Batterys of Guns and cannonaded the Village of Intiers till it was night, every body staid all night under arms at their Posts expecting the Enemy next Morning, My Lord Duke lay in a Tent between the Lines of Hanover foot, My Lord Orkney was posted in the Entrenchments, Engineers were sent into the Village of Intiers to fortify that Entrenchment and make Traverses where the Men were most exposed to cannon, Prince Eugene came with his Troops
