N.B. we had accounts the Enemy began very early that morning to decamp and we caused reconnoitre their March which was the very same way they had come by Ponta Marque towards Monsen Perre and Paches, Orders were given to hold the Army in a readiness to March so soon as we should see which way the Enemy intended.

The assembly beat to day at 11 and immediately to move to your ground a guard to be left with the Forrage, the Gen^{ls} to go to their quarters market, the Baggage to remain with the Train, the Maj^r of Brigade to be at my L^d Dukes at six to night, the eight Bat^s that were at Entieres are to be encamped between Tretin and Peronne, whenever the Gen^l beats we are to march in an hour after.

N.B. We had accounts that the Enemy continued their march towards Tournay by Bachy and the Plains of Camptin having sent all their Baggage before towards Tournay where Bridges were making for their Passage of the Shield. this made us change our Camp bringing the right to Peronne and the left to Trefsin much as we had been Camped when we first Passed the Marque my L^d Duke took his quarters at Langham in this Camp, it was there thought if we should remain till the Enemy Passed the Shield that they should not by a Point ^{get between us} and Lille as they might if we Passed the Marque too soon, however we were still orderd to be in a readiness and the heavy Baggage to remain
