the River to defend the Passage. Mont. De La Molle who had been with
his small Body about Bridges was sent for and came between and
made of Ghent and afterwards being reinforced with 12 Batt^s and some
beg^d from the Duke of Burgundy's Army march'd toward Brussels
which they gave out they would Besiege, but all they did was to cut
the Sluys of Vilvoorde which hinder'd for some days the Navigation
of the Canal. Brussels was reinforced with 4 Batt^s with Maj. Genl.
Murray and some German Cuirassiers. This day the Army made
a Movement and Changed the Camp to be more conveniently posted
for Forrage, the Right at Tronest and Hlern and the left running
towards Espinette the Dukes Quarters at Lannoy.
