This night the remaining part of the counterscarp at Chausin  
Covert of the Tenallies was Attacked but with indifferent  
Success. P. Eugene was wounded in the head

All the Boors Waggon that were to be found in the  
Army were ordered to be employed in the designed Convoy  
from Ostend which was yet kept pretty quiet this same day  
Mr Bings Fleet arrived at Ostend with Mr Earle and his  
Troops. The Army made a general Forrage by Corps.
