The 2^d M^o were ordered to mark out a Camp along the Chaussee from Lille to Menin to be more at hand to sustain the Convoys from Ostend having Acc^t that the Enemy were making Detachments that way to reinforce M^r Lemotte lest he should attempt any thing on Seffingh where we had taken Post or interrupt our Passage at Oudenburgh, 12 Batt^o more were Detach^d under M^r Gen^l Webb and Count Nassau to Oudenburgh who had Orders to go to Mouselle and from thence to advance towards Torhout in Case of Occasion to cover the Convoys. We received Advices that the D^o of Berwick was March^d with a strong Detach^t towards Bridges upon which Orders were sent to M^r Webb to Advance with his Detachment.

The Enemy having Advices of our Convoys and the Detach^t we had made M^r Delamotte with his Corps was orderd to watch us and a Body of about 10,000 Men, Commanded by the Lt Gen^l was dispatched towards Bridges to reinforce him and Acc^t were likewise brought that another Detach^t was March^d from the Duke of Burgundy Army to follow the D^o of Berwick towards Bridges, M^r Webb's Detach^t and the others advanced towards Torhout.
