Destrick and Hohlear upon which he drew all his foot up in  
two Lines in an opening on the Heath near Weynendale between  
two little Woods which covered his Flanks & posted the Battalions  
and Grenadiers that had been at Oudenburgh and came up  
a little before the Action in a third Line and likewise posted  
some Battalions and Pelotins in the Woods in front of the Flanks  
which flanked the opening through which the Enemy must come  
to him, about 3 o'clock, they began to Cannonade him and at 5  
Attack'd <sup>him</sup> with 4 Lines of Foot and 4 horse they were repulsed  
several times and all our people behaved extremely well The  
Enemy after several Attacks retired towards night and our  
people did the same, and came next day to Rouslaer where  
the Convoy had got safe before them, The Enemy thought to have  
in a manner eat us up and taken all our Convoy they being  
40 Battalions & 40 Squadrons and we not 7000 Men by reason  
of great Detachments that were out of our Battalions. The  
Enemys loss was computed about 3000 killed and wounded &  
ours not above 900 of which not above 115 killed

The same night the Enemy attempted to throw in a Sarcour <sup>the</sup>  
of Ammunition at the Douay port to Lille being 15 Squadrons  
with Sacks of powder before them and came in at our Circum <sup>the</sup>  
vallation at midnight calling out where they were challenged <sup>ed</sup>  
a Detachment from Marlboroughs Army but they were discovered <sup>ht</sup>  
when about 600 of them had yet within the Lines & Regiments  
taking Arms fired on them, those 600 got in to the Town and  
the rest made what haste they could back we killed & took  
several and in the Action their powder took Fire which  
blew up about 50 or 60 of them with such a prodigious noise <sup>ck</sup>  
that we thought it had been a Mine sprung
