intending to endeavour to get up our conveyance from Ostend. The

all the Dikes and were encamped with a small body at Sand-
vott, Evans with some Grenadiers and his Brigade took post
at Oudenburgh all last night, but those who are sent to observe
the inundation of Water by the cutting of Dikes, found it was
impracticable for Waggon's and that our conveyance could not
pass till new measures were taken it was Resolved the Army
should
