A Colonel to be commanded with 800 Men and Officers in propo-  
 ortion to go to Dixmude to fetch Corn, a L<sup>t</sup> Col<sup>l</sup> and Officers in pro-  
 portion with 500 Men to be commanded with Cap<sup>t</sup> Armstrong,  
 a Major with 200 Men to be commanded with Col<sup>l</sup> Spitswood  
 for making of Ways all those Detach<sup>ts</sup> to Assemble immediately at  
 the Mill of Hoghleid, a Major with 200 men of the English to be  
 commanded to escort the Forragers, the Forragers are to Assemble  
 presently at the head of their Reg<sup>ts</sup>, a Cap<sup>t</sup> and 50 Men of the English  
 to be Commanded immediately to go to Menin to escort the Suttlers  
 to the Camp, the Col<sup>l</sup> with 800 Men was sent to Dixmude to  
 get Corn which was to be allow'd in the Contributions the L<sup>t</sup> Col<sup>l</sup>  
 with 500 Men sent with M<sup>r</sup> Armstrong to cover the Workmen  
 who were to endeavor to repair the Dikes and the 200 that went  
 with M<sup>r</sup> Spotswood made roads towards Tielt, Roads were likewise  
 orderd to be made towards Harlbek and M<sup>r</sup> Armstrong went  
 to Ostend to prepare things to be sent on Horses through the inunda-  
 tion.
