 the Lt. Col. that commands the Posts on the Menin road is to send small
 Posts between them as he shall think fit. The Detach^{ts} to assem-
 ble at Rousselaer at Two a clock this Afternoon, the Lt. Col. to receive
 his Orders from the M. Genl. of the Day, at 3 in the afternoon 200
 Men with a Major &c. to be at the Mill of Hoghede he is to be Posted
 at the Castle of Weynendael where he will find 50 Horse under his com-
 mand, he will receive farther Orders from my Lord Albermarle, the De-
 tach^{ts} on the Menin Road will receive their Bread from the Waggon
