

first Battⁿ M^r Spotswood will bring them orders to send for the guards that were left on the Forrage at Camp of Roney and those who will may send for their Forrage, but the Baggage to remain at Menin no body to Forrage Thrashed Corn on Pain of Death nor to Forrage behind the Camp but in the front, the Reg^t that march are only to take their bare Horses and Sattlers with them, Evans and Ranks Brigades are to march a Lt Col^l and 100 Men to be at the Mill of Hoghede to morrow morning before 5 where Capt. King will bring them orders, they are to escort the Louton to Mochlaer all the Carpenters that can be found in the Army are to be there at the same time to march with them. N B M^r Cadogan who went himself to View the Passage to Leffingh sent for the Pontons to make Bridges over the several Ditches in the inundation and Pass over the Ammunition from the other side, which Communication was pretty good. Three Brigades marched to secure it some were Posted at St Peter Capelle, some at Mochlaer and the rest at Courtamarken all the Carpenters of the Army were ordered at the same time with them Abundance of Corn was ^{brought} in from Diamuyd and other Places.
