16th rest.

The Bread usually taken for 4 Days must serve for six, the rest must be paid the men in money. 200 foot with a field Officer immediately at the Dutch Train to escort 6th Cannon to Courtmarken, where M. Hagle will furnish a sufficient escort with them to join M. Cadogan. A Major with 100 foot at 8 to Morrow morning at the Dutch Train where he will have 50 Horse to join him to escort the Powder halfway to Menin, he's to receive his orders from M.

NB Overkerques Secretary. Orders were to spare all the corn that were possible and Magazines of what was got was layd up to be sent to Menin. The Enemy having found away to get so near with their small Vessells and Cannon to the Passage over the inundation they annoy us very much, M. Cadogan sent for some Cannon to try if he could raise a Battery against them, what Powder we Poss^d was sent to Lille.
