WB... We had Accounts that the Enemy had surprized Leffinghem and taken 1200 Men commanded by Colonel Coppel prisoner. This vexed my Lord Duke very much since we had certain intelligence that if we had kept that place but a few days longer the Enemy would have left the Scheld and marched to the Scarp. The Prince of Hesse marched with a Body of Troops and took post at La Bassée and began to Fortify it. Part of the Troops that were at Courtmark were sent under Brig. Evans command
