

MB The English marched the 18th to Harlebeck where they halted
 the 19th and 20th. All the Troops at this time were encamped
 in several Bodies, viz: The Prussians and Hanovers upon
 the Lis, The Danes at Vive St Eloye, The Imperialists, Hessians,
 Palatines and Dutch between the Lis and the Scheld and
 were all ordered to march in several Bodies the 21st to encamp
 as follows viz: The English at Tourcoin. The Imperialists at
 Bondues. The Hessians at Roncq. The Palatines at Linselles,
 The Prussians at Monseron and the Dutch at Waterloo and
 in that neighbourhood all the Troops where in this disposition
 to pass the Marque and the Deulle to form the two Armies
 The Imperials, Danes, Hessians, Palatines and Saxons, that of
 prince Eugene and the others that of my Lord Duke, The first
 to consist of 116 Squadrons and 66 Battalions between the Lis
 and the Deulle and the last of 163 Squadrons and 104 Battalions
 on the plains of Lille
