at 2 this Afternoon. The Sick to be on the Esplanade of Lille
The heavy Baggage to the same place immediately. The Majors
of Brigade and Aids de Camp between 4 and 5 at the Dukes
Quarters for the Orders of March. The orders of last Year for the
small Baggage to be observed every Battalion to send for two
days bread, every Waggon or Cart to be provided with a Spade or
Pickaxe.

113 Orders were given out at the usual time and the Maj^r of Brig^{ade}
and Aids de Camp to be at the Dukes between 4 and 5 for the
Orders of March, which were given as follows. That 4 retreat
should serve for a signal to pull down the Tents and be in a
readiness to March. The Lines of the Army broke in the middle
and Marched in 4 columns about 10 at night the left wing
passing at the Post a Trepin and the right, the Marque at
pont de bonoie soon after day the Army was in the neighbour-
hood of Journay.

27th Early in the Morning the Prince of Orange and L. Orkney
were Detached with 10 Battalions and 30 Squadrons towards
St Amand and Montaigne in order to take these posts, they
marched by Esplechin and upon the Donay chaussee to Monchin
from thence to Rumegies where Lord Orkney was Detached
from the Prince of Orange with 4 Battalions & 10 Squadrons &
2 pieces of Cannon to possess himself of Montaigne, he came before
it about 4 in the Afternoon and sent to summons the Garrison
to surrender which they refused (about 60 Men of a free company)
upon this Lord Orkney having information from the Peasants
that a passage could be made over the Scarp at a Watermill
a little above Chateau Labbaye he sent his Aid de Camp
with a party of Dragoons to make a Bridge and sent Brig^{ade}
Lalo with a Detachment of foot to pass there and come down
the.
