The Regiments for the Siege shall March to their Ground so soon as it is marked. The British give 2 Lieut Genls, 1 Major, and 2 Brigadiers. The Prussian 1, Lieut Genl, 1 Maj Genl, & 1 Brigad: The Hanovers 1 Brigadier and if Prince Eugene dont agree to give a Major General to us as required then the Hanovers are to give one. All the Carpenters of the Army to be to morrow at Break of day at the Bridge on the higher Scheld. The Drums of the whole Army (except the Besiegers) to be at 6 in the Morn: at the Mill of St Maure each Battalion is to make 3600 Fascines from 8 to 10 foot long 12 inches Diameter close and well bound at a foot and a half distance 1400 Pickets 7 or 8 Inches round 36 Mallets 72 Gabions for Sapps 4 foot and half high and 2 foot and half diameter & of the same wideness above as below.

MB The Camp for investing the place nearer by those employed in the Siege was Marked. The Generals were named The Duke and Prince are said to command the Siege Alternately: and 2 Generals of foot to have each an Attack. The English Battal: are 2, Orkney, Argyle, Temple, Evans, Meridyth & Prendergast & The Generals Withers, Argyle, Temple, Primrose and Sabine. The Besiegers were to be Encamped from the lower Scheld beginning with Prince Eugenes Troops to the Village of St Maur and from thence to the upper scheld bridge above the Chartreuse and so round the Town about Cannon Shot off till the left wing closed to the lower Scheld under Mount Trinity
