The Officer who Commands at the Bridge on the higher Scheld is to suffer the Duke's Foragers to pass and repass.

MB. An Officer of the Bombardiers was taken going into the Town the Weather proved so very rainy the Men could not work in the Trenches, to any purpose, however a small branch was run within about 150 paces of the Palisade of the Citadel & the Battery for about 24 pieces of Cannon to dismount those of the Enemy were made.
