W.B. The Armies continued their March thro the Bruiere de
Casteln to St Dennis and passed the Saine at Obourg encamp'd
from the River between St Anthoine and Namy by Sunphorien
towards Givry Prince Eugenes Army camped on the Bruiere
their left running to St Denis and Gottignys. The Prince of
Hesse who passed the Enemys lines early this Morning hav.^g
chased a small body that appeared encamped between Jemappe
and Rion with his Quarters at the Abby of Betian so that
Mons was in a manner invested, The few Troops the Enemy
had on the plain towards St Guilliam made the best of their
way into Mons and by Reports the Garrison consisted of
9 Battalions, a Regiment of Dragoons & one Squadron of Horse
