The Armies continued their March thro the Bruiere de Bastean to St Dennis and passed the Haire at Obourg, encamp. from the River between St Anthoine and Nimy by St Sunphorien towards Givray Prince Eugenes Army camped on y Bruiere their left running to St Denis and Gottignys. The Prince of Hesse who passed the Enemys lines early this Morning hav. chased a small body that appeared encamped between Jemappe and Lion with his Quarters at the Abby of Betan so that Mons was in a manner invested, The few Troops the Enemy had on the Haire towards St Guilliam made the best of their way into Mons and by Reports the Garrison consisted of 9 Battalions, a Regiment of Dragoons & one Squadron of Horse
