

morning for good success & had the disposition sent us for ^{the} 11
The Signal to attack being given by a discharge of all the
Artillery from Batterys we had made in the night. between
8 and 9 in the Morning (for no sooner could we act by reason
of an extraordinary thick Fog which about that time was
dissipated) Prince Eugenes Army with the Battalions from
Tournay and 20 Battalions under Count Sottum attacked
on the Bois de Sart and after some hours sharp dispute drove
the Enemy into the plain between the Wood and Engnerine
The Prussian Foot who attacked the part of the Wood near the
plain being pushed about 11 o'clock by fresh Battalions which
the Enemy sent from the Entrenchments on the plain to regain
that part of the Wood that flank'd them Lord Orkney sent in the
first Battalion of Guards and his own first Battalion to sustain
the Prussians who beat the Enemy out of the Wood again and
so we continued entirely masters of the Wood while it was thus
upon the right. The Dutch foot on the left were severely handled
having attacked with the utmost Bravery entrenchment after
entrenchment beat the Enemy out of them all, but fresh Troops
coming from all hands upon them they were beat out again
with great loss. and altho they attacked and again beat them
out of all their entrenchments yet it was impossible for them
to maintain themselves by reason of the great number who
attacked them from all the plains but tho it cost them dear
it contributed very much to the gain of the Battle by reason
of the very great Diversion it gave to the Enemy, from employing
these Troops against our right. For in the mean time Lord
Orkneys Command took possession of the entrenchments
near the Woods and gave our Horse opportunity to come up
and formid throw the Overtures the Enemys had left which the
