enemy perceiving they advanced with both their lines of Horse
and came to the charge with ours before we had above 30 squadⁿ
formed through the overtures which at first put ours in confusion
being sustained by fresh squadrons and by the foot under Lord
Orkney they charged the enemy's several times and found
them at last to retreat, during the first little advantage their
horse had over ours they brought down some foot to regain the
entrenchment from our Foot and had actually beat some
Hanover Battalions from it but being encouraged by Lord
Orkney they took up post again then the enemy (perceived
that the Detachment under the Duke of Argyl had got thro'
the Wood on the left) fearing to be taken in Flank went off
altogether both Foot and horse we pursued them about a league
and remained Masters of the Field of Battle 14 pieces of Cannon
with several Standards and Colours which with some prisoners
were the trophies of this glorious dear bought Victory where our
Foot (especially Brittish and Dutch) gave the enemy's clear
proof that they could beat them any where. The enemy retired
by Bayay towards Gueinoye

12 In the afternoon the Army marched back thro' the field of
(St Jaques and Turin) battle to our former camp of Benignes, but
there being several wounded Officers in that castle The Duke
took his Quarters at the Abby of Belian. Ordered to take the
Names and Qualities of all the wounded Officers of the French
found either in Houses or the field of Battle and upon giving
their parole to have leave to be transported. we had
certain Accounts that Marshall Villars was wounded by a
Musket Shot in the Knee and that Mons De Buffler had
taken Command of their Army which encamped between
Gnesnoye and Valenoyenne
