The 2^d W^{rs} of the right wing to be at the British Artillery at 6 in the Morning and those of the left at the Dutch in order to mark new Ground, to be ready to move into it at 10 the next day and when we move to send the same number of Sick as we did last to the Bread Waggons, all horses, Arms & Accoutrements of our Army found in or since the Battle to be returned to the right owner. WB. The Army being too far from Mons: to cover the Siege and our convoys at the same time, it was resolved to take up another Camp so soon as the Detachment for the Siege was made.
