MB. We lodged in the 3 Salient Angles of the Counterscarp of the Hornwork of Berlamont and cleared almost all the covered way, we had about 80 killed and wounded at the Havre Attack we enlarged our Lodgements and made some small Batterys to dismount some guns of the Enemy's that played into our Trenches. A Bomb of the Enemy's blew up some of ours as one of ours did likewise some of theirs

MB. we were Masters of the whole Counterscarp and the place of Arms upon the right at the Berlamont Attack we had a Lap: About 100 Men killed and wounded at the Havre Attack we wrought to Drain some Water betwixt us and the 2^d Toffee.
