April 14th The British Troops marched from Ghent under command of Lieut. General Lumley and encamped at Beveren near Oudenarde

15th They marched with the Danish Troops to Rijkhoven

16th To Deltignies. and halted the 17th

18th They marched and encamped along the Chaussee between Jonto & Trefoin and Tournay

19th The Troops which were to compose the Duke of Marlbro's Army marched near Tournay and those of Prince Eugene's to the plains of Lillo

20th Both Armies marched about 5 at night directly to the Enemy's lines on the Denille where Mons^r D Artaquan was encamped with a body of Troops but retired upon our approach

21st The Army having passed the lines without any Opposition encamped on the plains of Lens.

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
