

- 22^d The Army marched at 10 in the Morning. The Duke of Marlborough passing the Scarp at Vitry encamped at Genlzin and Prince Eugene encamped between the Denil and the Scarp. 23^d halted
- 24th Donay being in a manner invested lines of Circumvallation were ordered to be marked and carried on the 25th
- 26th 1000 Men ordered to take post at Arlense and workmen sent to cut the River to turn the Course NB. of a Branch that came from the Somsette on a Canal to Douay above the Inundation
- 27th The Army's decamped and took their posts in the Circumvallation all the foot between the higher and lower Scarp and from post anby on the Denil to the Scarp. The horse were encamped from Forrest to the abby of Flines and from thence along the Scarp by the Road to Tournay. The Duke took his Q^r at Flines and the Prince at Forrest
- 28th Continued to perfect the Circumvallation & Communications
- 29th Nothing extraordinary
- 30th We had orders to make Fascines
- May 1st The General Officers for the Siege of Douay were named
- 2^d The Battalions were named for the Siege
- 3^d Nothing extraordinary
- The Disposition for the Siege was, That there should be two Attacks one on the right towards Porte Dignerschin under the direction of the Prince of Anhalt General of the Prussian foot and the other on the left near the Port D Ocre under direction of the Prince of Orange, each of these Gen^{ls} had under their Command, two Lt Gen^{ls} 4 Maj Gen^{ls} 4 Brig^s & 20 Battalions
