

The Trenches to be relieved at 4 this Afternoon by the Regiments of Sutton, Metrail, Smidt and Dubruit. at 5 in the Afternoon 1200 Workmen commanded by a Lieut. Col: to be relieved at 4 in the Morning by a Major and 1000

MB About 9 at night The Enemy made a very great Sorty with all the Grenadiers and a detachment of their Dragon foot and first alarm'd our people on the left, come in upon them on the right where the 2^d Parallel was not joyned to the other Attack Colonel Sutton's Regiment that was posted there being in some surprize was put in confusion and suffered much. The Enemy threw down a few paces of our Parallel and forced to retire. Sutton's Regiment had their Major a Capt. several Officers and about 200 killed and wounded

The Regiments for the Trenches to be at the parade at 3 this Afternoon viz: Honeywood, Salische Albermarle & Tecklenburg at 1/2 an hour after 5 to night a Lieut. Col: & 700 Workmen to be relieved at break of day by a Major and 500.

MB The Trenches to be relieved henceforward at 8 in y^e Morning and the Genl. Officers for the next day to take the Orders. To morrow for the Trenches, Mordaunt Ghor Dedem & Lander.

MB. The Communications being made good the Regiments were ordered to mount the Trenches in the Morning. The 2^d Parallel was finished tho not joyned with the Attack on the right but care was taken to secure the Flanks & to make good communications between it and the first Parallel.
