on the Canal of Donway except that of Pont a Vendin where our
Convoy must pass.

The Pickets returned and our Convoy came safe to the Neigh-
bourhood of the Camp, our Hussars came up with a party of the
Enemy's horses who had been to reconnoitre our Camp killed a
good many of them & took an Officer & some Troops Prisoners

Pont Negy and attacked them with such Vigour that they took
most of them prisoners 2 Officers and several Men were killed on the
Spot, We did not yet move the Camp

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
