Baggage

The great Baggage at 6 this Afternoon on the plain between the Abby of Annay and Old Vendin and stay there all night & to morrow to begin their March at the same with the two Trains The Genl's Baggage first, followed by that of the Series as they are camped The first line first and the second after and March in the high road that goes through Annekin and Sailly to Benory and are to camp all night between the said Villages of Benory and Bethune. 2 Batt's. to march with the Train and 200 horse and 2 Batt's & 200 horse with the Baggage and to encamp with them this night at the Abby of Annay

The Drums with the new Grand Guard are to be at 2 in y^e Morning at the British Guards where the Drums Genl will call for them

A Genl of the Horse &c and 30 Squadrons drawn up at 2 this Morning on the height of Mericour to stay there till all y^e Army is passed the Touchet and afterwards to follow the March of the Cavalry of the right wing and be the Rear Guard of all they are to camp to morrow at the left of the Army, to be the rear Guard next day, The old Grand Guard is to join these Squadrons & to march with them to the Camp. 500 Foot to take post in Lens & remain there till the rear Guard has passed the Touchet & then they are to March with them to the Camp. The Officer Commanding the rear Guard is to take care that as soon as the Lines are passed the Bridges of Boats to take them up and bring them with him to y^e Camp all the Troops camped out of the line are to take their posts on the March The Genl beats at 4 and March at 5.
