All heavy Baggage to be at the Train this Afternoon at 4. Suters found in the line to be plundered. The Genl. of the day to be at the Dukes Quarters at 6 at night, 200 and 2 Captains from the Right to be at Genl. Badogans Quarters at 5 this night where they will get Tools and Orders, The commanders see that no body stir from their Reg^{ts} no horses to go a-grazing. all to be ready to march

6 at night.

The Retreat to beat as usual, the Tents to be struck, as it grows dark, no fires more then Ordinary to be made in the camp on pain of death, to march at 10 with all possible silence. The Reg^{ts} to close, close to one another. The Baggage horses to march on the Flanks when the ground will permit it. The Genls to be at their posts on the line where they will find Guides to conduct them.

Order of March the 5th August from Viller Brulin to Vergiere. The Army files off by the left and marches in 4 columns. The left and right wing each in 2. in the following manner.
