The right wings gives 17 Battalions and the left 13, The Gen^{ls} and Troops Commanded are to be at two this afternoon at the Bridge of Neuville, The line of Battle to be marked out and the Ground each Regiment is to have to be assigned to the *Prin^{ts}* who are to make Report of it to their commanders and they are to send to the Dutch Train for 50 Tools of Battalion and the *Prin^{ts}* are to lead their Men to morrow morning to the Work appointed for them. The commanding Officer may relieve them asoft as he pleases, Orders to morrow at 3 at the Duke's.
