

and there pass the Scheld continuing their March on the plains
on the other side to the camp, having in all the March the Infantry
of the right wing on their right. The Infantry of the right Wing
marches by the left in one column the second line first and the
first after them, by the great Road that goes to Nensville where
they passed the Scheld on the Bridges made, and continue their
March through the plains to the camp always having the Caval-
ry of the right wing on their left. The Cavalry of the left wing
marches by the left in one column, the second line first and the
first after them and pass the Scheld on the Bridge of Boats made
at Lourche, on the right of the great Farm, continuing the March
through the plain to the camp having the Infantry of the left
wing on their left. The Infantry of the left wing marches by the
left in one column the 2^d first and the first after them passing
the Scheld on the Bridge on the left of the great Farm at Lourche
and continue their March through the Plain to the camp,
having in all the March the Infantry of the right wing on their
left and the Cavalry of the left wing on their right. A General
of Horse and 30 Squadrons for the Rear Guard to morrow at 4
at Avenne le Secq. there to remain till the whole Army has
passed the Scheld and then to follow the Columns of the right
wing to the camp, 12 pieces of Cannon of 3 pound each command-
ed from the Train for the rear Guard. All the Grenadiers of the
whole to post themselves at 4 in the Morning at the Bridges of
Lourche and Neufville where they are to remain till all the
Cavalry of the rear Guard have passed the said Bridges and then
conjunctly with the said Cavalry to the camp, & then to join their
Regiments. The Regiments camped at Donchy, Haspre, Ivry,
Houdain, or otherwise out of the line to march at 4 and take
up post in the line on the March. The Infantry of the 2^d line of
the
