Baggage

The great Baggage marches at 2 this Afternoon those of the right wing pass the Scheld between the Village of Reulot & Neufville and they of the left at Lourches they will be drawn up on the height of Abscons, and Genl Dops will give them a sufficient Escort for that night and to morrow they are to march to their camp

Artillery

The two Artilleries March this day at 12, The British pass at Neufville and the Hollands at Lourche then drawn up on the height of Abscons for that night and to morrow they march into their camp. Genl Fagel will give 4 Batts. of his Corps to camp with them. The Troops commanded by Generals Fagell and Dops remain on the ground till all the Army has passed the Scheld and then follow the March of the Army to the camp where every Regiment is to join their own Corps. all Regiments to carry with them their Straw, Forrage and Pickets
