Orders to be immediately published for the better preservation of the Discipline & preventing disorders in the Army.

Upon the March, no Non Commissioned Officer, Trooper, Dragoon or foot Soldier shall be one hundred paces from his corps on pain of being whipt by the common hangman

Upon coming into the camp no Trooper, Dragoon or foot Soldier or Servant shall go a Forraging without Orders or their Officers to conduct them, neither shall any Soldiers go for Straw without Officers on pain of being severely whipt as above

Upon return of the Men from foraging or fetching Straw the Officers shall cause the Trusses and Tents to be examined to see if the Troopers, Dragoons or Foot Soldiers have brought in any plunder and shall take care to punish severely such as bring any thing in, is not permitted

Upon resting days no Trooper, Dragoon, or Foot Soldier shall go without the Grand Guard and all such as shall be found offending shall be severely whipt by the provost upon the Spot and all such as shall force any Safs guards, or plunder any Churches, Cloisters or Castles or any private House, and all persons on whom any plunder shall be found shall be deemed the plunderers & suffer death accordingly & the Officers are required to call over their Ralls thrice aday in order to punish such as shall be Absent.

And
