

And it is further declared that the Corps to which any Soldiers belong who shall have committed disorders in plundering any houses or other places shall be answerable for the same and those who have suffered upon making proof of the Agreemen shall be forthwith indemnified and the Money paid shall be brought to Account of such Corps without any Excuse but if it be afterwards made appear that the Soldiers of any other Corps were concerned in those disorders such Corps shall likewise pay their proportion of the damage.

The Commandants of the Respective Corps are to take care that on a March none be sent out but the Regimental Drums and the respective Drums of the several Troops of horse and Dragoons and for the Foot only the Regimental Drums with one Man of a Company.

The Provost Generals are hereby Authorized as well by the General of the Army as those of the respective national Corps to whip severely all such as shall be found without the Grand Guards and to punish with death such as shall force any Guard Guards, plunder any Churches, Castles, Cloisters private houses or be found with any plunder upon them. The provost Generals are likewise authorized to visit and examine the Tents and Waggon, and Carts of all Suters and such on whom any plunder shall be found shall be hanged, the Horses, Waggon, Carts & Goods confiscated to the use of the General Provost who shall Seize the same.

And to the end none may pretend Ignorance tis directed that those Orders be immediately read at the head of each Battalion and Squadron and the Provost is directed to publish the same to the Suters and their Serv<sup>ts</sup> who are subjected to the same Punishment as the Soldiers.
