

The Column of Horse is to pass the Selle at Neuveville and from thence to continue its March over the Plain to the Camp leaving the Village of Neillie and Veiers lauchie upon their left and the Column of Foot always to the right. The Column of Foot to pass the Selle on the Bridge of pontoons made between Briate and Solemnes and from thence to continue their March to the Camp leaving the line of Horse on their left, and the Artillery & Baggage always on their right. The Artillery and Baggage to pass the Selle at Solemne and from thence to continue their March to the Camp by the great Road taking care to leave the Columns of the wing on the left and the Villages of St Pethin Montue Cour and Haspne on the right

The Baggage to Assemble at four in the Morning behind the Artillery and to follow its March to the Camp

The Quarter Masters of Horse and Foot with a detachment of 100 horse for a new Grand Guard to assemble at the head of the British Fusiliers to morrow morning at four where they shall receive their Orders from the Quarter Master General.

The Old Grand Guards to make the Rear of all

The General to beat at four in the Morning and the Army to March at six a Detachment of 300 foot and 30 horse shall Assemble at the head of the Artillery at four in the Morning and Escort it from thence to Camp

The Battalions encamped at Chatteau Cambresis to march at 4 in the Morning and leaving the Selle upon their right shall continue their March to the plain between Solemne & Briate and there wait till the line of Foot passes the Selle and to take their posts in at upon the March. All the other Battalions encamped out of the line, to march half an hour before the Army moves and to take their posts in the line upon the March.

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
