Order of March for the Army commanded by his Grace the Duke of Armond to go from the Camp at Avesme le seig to Plines to morrow the 18 July 1712

The Army is to File off by the right in two Columns after the following manner.

All the horse shall File off from the right in one Column & the Foot in another the first line of Foot to March foremost and the second to follow; these two Columns shall March from their Camp to the Bridges laid upon the Scheld over against the burned cause of Bouctrinew where having passed the River shall continue their March jointly over the plain towards Leuward where they shall seperate and the Column of Horse shall take the great Road to pont a Ruche and the Foot to Pont ala lain where they shall pass the Scarps & from thence continue their march to the Camp leaving the Villages of Marguette Monchicour
