Order of March for the Army commanded by his Grace the Duke of Armond to go from the Camp at L'hopital de Theomolin to that of Fleurioal to morrow the 20th July 1712.

The Army is to File off from the right in one Column as it is encamp't the horse first and the foot after them and to take along the great road from Orchies to Tournay till they come near the Port St. Martin and then to strike off to the left leaving the Glacis upon the right and the Village of Oregue upon the left and continue their March along the great Road that goes from Tournay to Pont d'Espiere till they come into their Camp

The Artillery is to follow the March of the Army and the Baggage to follow the March of the Artillery. The Quartermast. with the new Grand Guard to assemble at three in the Morning at the head of my Lord Stairs Regiment where they shall receive their Orders from the Quarter M^r. Genl.
