

They who are to weak to go in the Waggon must be sent to Tournay to go by Water

Order of March for the Army Commanded by his Grace the Duke of Ormond to go from the Camp at Plurival to that of Petteghem to morrow the 22^d July 1712

The Army to File off by the left in one Column as it was encamped the Horse Foremost and the foot after and to take along the great Road of Audenaerde continuing the same till they come into their Camp. The Artillery to follow the March of the Army

The Baggage to follow the March of the Artillery. The Drums with the new Grand Guard to assemble at the head of Vandermaets Regiment at one in the Morning where they shall receive orders from the Quarter M^r Genl. The heavy Baggage to assemble behind the Artillery at two in the Morning. A Detachment of 200 foot to assemble at the head of the Artillery at two in the Morning to march with the Artillery. A Detachment of 30 horse to assemble behind the Artillery at three in the Morning to march along with the Baggage.

The Genl to beat at two & the Army to march at three in the Morning. The Orders against Moiders & Plunderers are to be repeated, and the Provost to be sent out as usual. All Sukars to take care their Waggon and Carts march with those of the Regiments they belong to under penalty of being plundered. The present Grand Guard to make the rear Guard of all.
