

The Army to File off from the right in one Column as it is encamped the Horse first and the Foot after and to take along the great Road from Oudenarde to Ghent till they come to the Mill of Aspre and then strike off to the left to enter into the Camp. The Artillery is to follow the March of the Army the Baggage is to follow the March of the Artillery. The ^{2^d} ^{Mr} with a new Grand Guard to assemble at two in the morning at the head of my Lord Stairs Regiment, where they shall have orders from the ^{2^d} ^{Mr} Gen^l. The heavy Baggage to assemble behind the Artillery at three in the Morning. A Detachment of 200 foot to assemble at the head of the Artillery at three in the Morning to march with the Artillery. A Detachment of 30 horse is likewise to assemble behind the Artillery at four to march with the Baggage. The General to beat at three and the Army to march at four in the morning. The Orders against Plunderers and Murderers to be repeated and the Provost sent out as usual. The Suttlers are to take care their Carts and Waggon's march with those of the Regiments they belong to under penalty of being plundered. The present Grand Guard to make the rear Guard of all
