

37 The Generals of the day are to go to the line and see the daily orders obeyed the sick to be carried immediately to the Broad Waggon and they are to carry them to Ghent. Order of March for the Army commanded by his Grace the D. of Ormand to go from the Camp at Nazareth to that of Dronghen to Morrow th 25 July 1712. The Army to file off from the right in one column and march in the following manner, The Horse of the first line to march foremost and to be followed by the Horse of second line, the foot of the first line to follow the Horse of the second line, and the foot of the second line to follow the foot of the first line all filing off from the right as they are encamped and shall take along the great Road to the Village of Dure where having passed the Lis upon the Bridges of Pontons they shall continue their march along the great Road of Ghent to the Camp. The Artillery to follow the march of the Army, and the Baggage to follow the Artillery. The 2^d Lt. Col. with the new grand Guard to assemble at the Windmill before the Regt. of Rose at three in the morning where they shall receive orders from the 2^d Lt. Col. Genl. a Detach^t of 200 foot to assemble before the Artillery at four in the morning to march with the Artillery. A Detachment of 30 Horse to assemble behind the Artillery at five in the morning to march with the Baggage, The Baggage to assemble behind the Artillery at five in the morning, the Orders against Plunders and Morades to be repeated and the Provost sent out as usual, the Genl. to beat at four and the Army to march at five in the morning. The Butlers to take care their Waggon and Carts march with those of the Regt. they belong to under penalty of being plundered. The present grand Guard to make the rear Guard of all.
