or wounded, for we saw them carried off, five of
them - I had forgotten to mention that
in the course of yesterday afternoon we killed
or wounded 57 Men, three boats full of people
had come down the river with ammunition
to the tete de pont. at each of these we had
two fair shots with our six pounder laden with
