

when it is all most could put therin 4 ounces of turpentine well washed with whit wine and 3 drams of camfer well pounded then make them up in bowles and kope them in parchment this plaister is good for wounds and for sores both new and old for bruises and aches and it doth mundifie ulcers and old sores with paine it comforteth the members that it lyeth on it is good for stifnes and ulcerat~~and~~ cankers

A speciall Medyson for all maner of aches

Take a spaid pitch and cut her throat hang her up by the ~~feet~~ nine leges that she may bleed well then slit her belly and take out her bowels and with a linen cloth dry up all her bloud in every part and let noe water cume in her take skinn and cut off the head then take a pint of gray snails a pound of smallege a pound of wild mallows leaves 2 pound of sage a pound of arsesmart such as hath black spots put all this in to the biches belley and sowe her up close and put her upon a spit and rost her by the fire keepe the dripping in a cleane vessel

To Make a salve or plaister

Take the roots of marsh mallows wash and pick them cleane and take out the inward pith cast it away and take the ^{out}ward and that is faire and whit and cut it in small peces and bruse them in a mortar and take of them halfe a pound and put them in to a new earthen pan put therin 10 of line seeds and fene or ick of each 2 ounces a lited brused in a mortar then take mansey and whit wine of each a pint and sture these together and let it in fuse 2 or 3 dayes then
