Jan A poultice

Take a handfull of uilet leaues one handfull of u
ilet leaues sulendine leaues 2 handfulls of mallas
boyle thes in a pint of kuning water and when they
be halfe boyled and when they be halfe boyled put in
halfe and ounce of oyle of lilley and as much oyle of
uilets and boyle them till the stalks and all be tender
and so apply them to the place infected

Jan A Decait for mallancady for the winde water
the pacion of the hart and weakness of the
back the kisinge of the lunges to open the
liuer and for good digestion and to stren
then all the parts of the body

Take harts horne 2 sponfull of safrant halfe a spones
ull Auant roots halfe and ounce gallingall roots
