Take your tungs the largest you can get and take
as much rock peter as will lye one a six pence and
take your tunge and cut a litle deepe hole abo
ut the pallet betwene the 2 grisells and put in
rock peter and lame it well in and put in a dr
ope or too of brine after it to moyse it a litle
and then salt them well and lay them in a cr
ock uery close and let them lye about a for
thnight or 3 weeks till they felle pretty stife a
nd then take them out and hange them neere
the aire of the fire but not to neere the smoke
and so let them hange for the space of 4 or
5 dayes and then boyle them and when th
ey are cold they may be eaten after this m
aner you may Cures your uesfallye backen
with this rock peter but you ^{put} must more in
them then you doe in your tungs 3 or 4 times
as much and dry them in the chimney and
then boyle them in hay and it will make them
look red with in and black with out -
